

Strong, local identity manifested in district 'Boards', supported by professional staff and directors.


## Objective





# Safeguarding & Protecting Children

DCB has as its primary responsibility to implement sound child welfare policies and procedures and support good practice at all levels

## Objective

1. Clubs working within the guidelines of Safe Hands and looking to practice in a way which puts the needs and well-being of children at the centre of what they do.
2. Welfare Officers having the primary focus of adequate child safeguarding training and the bespoke ECB training on *Implementing Safe Hands* into their club. This will have been achieved when all clubs have a trained welfare officer.
3. Continue to work with coaches around the ethos of working with children and young people to help them both enjoy and achieve on and off the cricket pitch.
4. All DCB member organisations need to be aware of their responsibilities in terms of child welfare and ensure that the structures that they have in place promote the well-being of children and young people.

## Performance indicator

1. All clubs with a Junior Section to have successfully completed Clubmark accreditation and, where appropriate, to have been re-accredited.
2. Welfare Officers to have completed the correct training for their role. This means that not only will Devon need to maintain a pool of appropriately trained trainers, but they will need to continue to offer Welfare Officers the access to training.
3. Develop good practice in safeguarding and child welfare through coaches and team managers working with children. In accordance with Safe Hands there needs to be development through clubs of an ethos of child welfare being a whole club concern and not just the preserve of one or two people with a "Welfare Officer" title.
4. To develop the club model of safeguarding advocated through Safe Hands through all members of the organisation.
